Although only 25 years old, she has already won one of the most prestigious film awards in

Poland. Her performance was recognized at the 48th Gdynia Polish Film Festival, where she received the award for professional acting debut (for the film "The Feast of Fire").

Paulina is a student at the Theatre Academy in Warsaw, majoring in acting and vocal specialization. She graduated from the Karol Szymanowski Music School No. 4 in the oboe class and from the Fryderyk Chopin European Music School in the vocal performance department. She has worked with directors such as Wojciech Kościelniak, Michał Walczak, Denis Delić, and Filip Gieldon and made her debut in Kinga Dębska's film "The Feast of Fire" based on the novel by Jakub Małecki. She received the award for Best Actress at the Polish Film Festival in Toronto and during the 48th Gdynia Polish Film Festival.

Paulina currently performs at the 6th Floor Theatre in the play "Sinatra 100+". She also sings and composes her own songs, which could be heard at her recital "Jackie" at the Collegium Nobilium Theatre at the Theatre Academy in Warsaw.

Paulina will participate in the Q&A session before the movie and will meet with festival audiences.



AS IT WAS (13m)



The filmmaker accosts them, asks questions, talks about how they deal with life. Standing there with his camera for over 2 years he has created a space for dialogue, a lay confessional of sorts, where everyone can stop by and tell their story. The protagonists carry secrets and mysteries, and are not easy to label. Every story is unique, and life always surpasses imagination. "The

Balcony Movie" is a radical comeback to the beginnings of cinema, when man approached the camera. Maybe it's enough to stop for a moment to get a deeper insight?

The story intertwines with the journeys of Ignac, a young peasant seeking recognition of his nobility, and Domingo, Kościuszko's loyal friend and former slave. As they navigate political

turmoil and personal challenges, the film explores themes of freedom, equality, and human resilience. Starring Jacek Braciak, Bartosz Bielenia, Jason Mitchell, and Robert Wieckiewicz, "Scarborn" won Best Film at the Gdynia Film Festival for its modern, action-packed take on Polish history.
